



An Opening Repertoire for the Attacking Player

Raymond Keene, David Levy

The average player has insufficient time, or inclination, to spend hours of study on opening theory. However, to obtain a satisfactory middle game, a good understanding of the principles is essential, with a more detailed knowledge of some of the more complicated variations also proving advantageous. In this new edition of a popular title the authors have completely revised and updated a repertoire for both White and Black which will allow the reader to reach interesting and sharp positions with the minimum of study. A parallel volume, *Chess Openings for You* by Bernard Cafferty applies the same principles for the more conservative, positional player. Raymond Keene, an International Grandmaster is author of many books including *Learn from the Grandmasters*, *Becoming a Grandmaster* and two classic opening works with George Botterill: *The Pirc Defence* and *The Modern Defence*. International Master David Levy is author of *The Sicilian Dragon*, *Sacrifices in the Sicilian* and, with Kevin O'Connell, *How to play the Sicilian Defence* and *How to play the King's Indian Defence*.
